God is with Us!

Years ago, when my daughter was itty bitty, we decided it was time for her to lose the training wheels and learn to ride a bike.

I took her down to an empty parking lot and watched her ride, then said, "Okay honey it's time to do it on your own." The very idea frightened her. But after some cajoling she let me remove the training wheels as long as I promised to hold on and stay with her.

So there we were, her on her bike, and me holding on to her seat and handle-bar, jogging alongside as she rode on two wheels.

As she got the hang of it, I slowly removed my hands from the bike and let go.

My daughter declared, "Look Dad! I'm doing it!" I was smiling from ear to ear as I said, "You're doing great! And don't worry, I may have let go—but I'm still right here."

On the 40th day after Easter, Christians celebrate Ascension Day—the day Jesus took off our training wheels - ascending to the heavens—and leaving his followers to carry on His work.

The very idea of Jesus letting us go on our own is as scary for us as it was for



my daughter—especially in light of COVID where the average church has sustained losses in contributions and regular attendance.

But Christ trusts us to find our balance, choose our direction—and while He may have let go, He's always here.

So we ask: Where are the training wheels in our lives?

Are we stretching our minds?

Challenging our bodies?

Exercising our souls?

Ascension Day asks us to consider our maturity—and the ways we are losing the training wheels—and trusting in God's faith in us to do the work.

Kids Club Tutoring Program

On Wednesday, May 4, St. David's proudly kicked off our new partnership with Vandenberg World Cultures Academy. In this community outreach project, 10 volunteer parishioners work with K-5th grade students to reinforce literacy and math skills. The program runs weekly, 3:30-4:30 pm in the Parish Hall until June 8 and perhaps will expand in the Fall. Monica Eason, Vandenberg principal invited families to participate and worked with Fr. Chris and Judy Walsh to design the program.

Vandenberg is a part of Southfield Public Schools and is a magnet school for English Language Learners. Students from 27 countries speak 29 languages. St. David's has enjoyed a strong partnership with the school over the past 12 years, including a pen pal program, in-class mentors, tutors and support of food, backpack and school supply drives.

St. David's looks forward to using its updated campus to welcome neighborhood families and students. This is a win-win opportunity for all involved. St. David's volunteers are excited to embrace our mission aspects of outreach and love for all by supporting this project

Bishop Bonnie Perry, in conjunction with Diocesan Council and the Deans of our diocese have challenged our diocese to raising \$100,000 for support for humanitarian efforts in Ukraine. The diocese kicked off the campaign with \$50,000 from the diocesan operating fund. The fundraising effort goes from April 18 through June 5 – the 50 days of Easter.

Shaken by the devastation wrought by the invasion of Ukraine by the Russian military, St. David's was happy to do our part. The Vestry decided to host a Dinner for Ukraine featuring Eastern European food often eaten in Ukraine. Led by Mary Bensmiller a committee was quickly formed and a menu of pierogi, golabki, kielbasa and cookies was chosen. The food was purchased from Srodek's Quality Sausage Company in Hamtramck and finished here.

Thanks to Mary Bensmiller, Kitchen Queen and Janet Ernst doing the organizing we soon had a project plan in place. On Friday, April 29 we hosted the Festive Dinner for Ukraine. The event exceeded our expectations. We offered both a dine-in option and a takeout option. Both were equally popular. We served the takeout orders from the front door with patrons using the circle driveway. The Fellowship Hall was decorated in blue and yellow, the colors of the Ukrainian flag. Tables were decorated with miniature flags and sunflowers which are the national flower of Ukraine.

We served over 200 golabki (stuffed cabbage), 50 dozen pierogi, 160 Kielbasa and 120 cookies! With the generous support of our congregation, families and friends we raised over \$3,000!

The money raised will go to Episcopal Relief and Development (ERD) to support persons affected by the humanitarian crisis in Ukraine. ERD working with its partners in Europe are coordinating immediate and long-term humanitarian efforts in Romania, Poland, Hungary and Slovakia. In time, ERD will also support resettlement efforts in the United States.

A successful project requires many dedicated volunteers. Special thanks go out to Chelsea Liddy Pivtorek whose husband is of Ukrainian descent. They donated the sunflowers, beer and wine plus Chelsea manned the bar and saw to it that the event was publicized in the Ukrainian community. To everyone who helped set-up, decorate, acted as cashier, waited on guests and bussed tables, cooked food, served the food and cleaned up we extend a very grateful **THANK YOU!** It would not have happened without you!
